Kuala Lumpur, the federal capital of Malaysia, is a rapidly developing metropolis and the principal centre of commerce, politics, entertainment and international activities. The city's skyline is rapidly changing and currently dominated by the world's tallest buildings: the Petronas Twin Towers at 452 metres high closely followed by the Menara Kuala Lumpur, the world's fourth tallest building. Despite modernisation, Kuala Lumpur still retains its old world charm depicted in the majestic buildings of the colonial era, distinctive Moorish architecture and quaint Chinese shophouses.

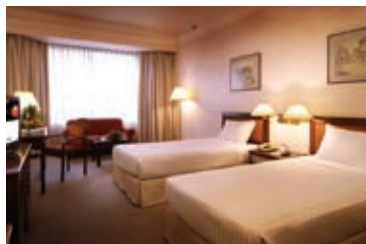
Kuala Lumpur is also one of the best places in the Far East for shopping, offering replica designer goods at knock down prices. ### ESSENTIAL EXPERIENCES

**KUALA LUMPUR HIGHLIGHTS** This combination package combines a half-day city tour, including the Petronas Twin Towers, with a tour of Kuala Lumpur by night so you can experience the colourful night market before enjoying a typical Malaysian dinner.

**HISTORICAL MALACCA** 2 hours drive south of Kuala Lumpur is Malacca, the oldest trading port in Malaysia, which has undergone Portuguese, Dutch and English rule. Visit St. Paul's Hill for a good view of Malacca Straits and the old town of Bandar Hilir, the famous Portuguese Fort de Santiago and the ruins of St. Paul's Church lined by 17th century Dutch tombstones. After lunch you can take a stroll down 'Antique Row' at Jonker Street and on the way back you will stop by Cheng Hoon Teng, the oldest Chinese temple in Malaysia, and view Kampong Kling, a typical Malay village. Full-day trip.

**KUALA SELANGOR FIREFLIES** Visit the countryside of Kuala Selangor, a small rustic town known for its historic past and natural heritage of Mangrove forest and bird sanctuary. You will enjoy a walk through the jungle followed by lunch in a local restaurant before boating upstream to watch thousands of fireflies sparkle in the thick mangrove along both sides of the river. Note: Sighting of fireflies is subject to weather conditions. Full-day trip.

**BATU CAVES** This tour will take you through the Ambassadors' Row in Ampang to view Malaysian suburban homes as well as the rustic rural area, then to the Royal Selangor Pewter factory before stopping at the spectacular Batu Caves, with its cavernous interior, home to Hindu deities. A climb of 272 steps is required to fully appreciate the caves. Stopping on the way back at a Batik factory. Half-day tour.
