HIDDEN TREASURES



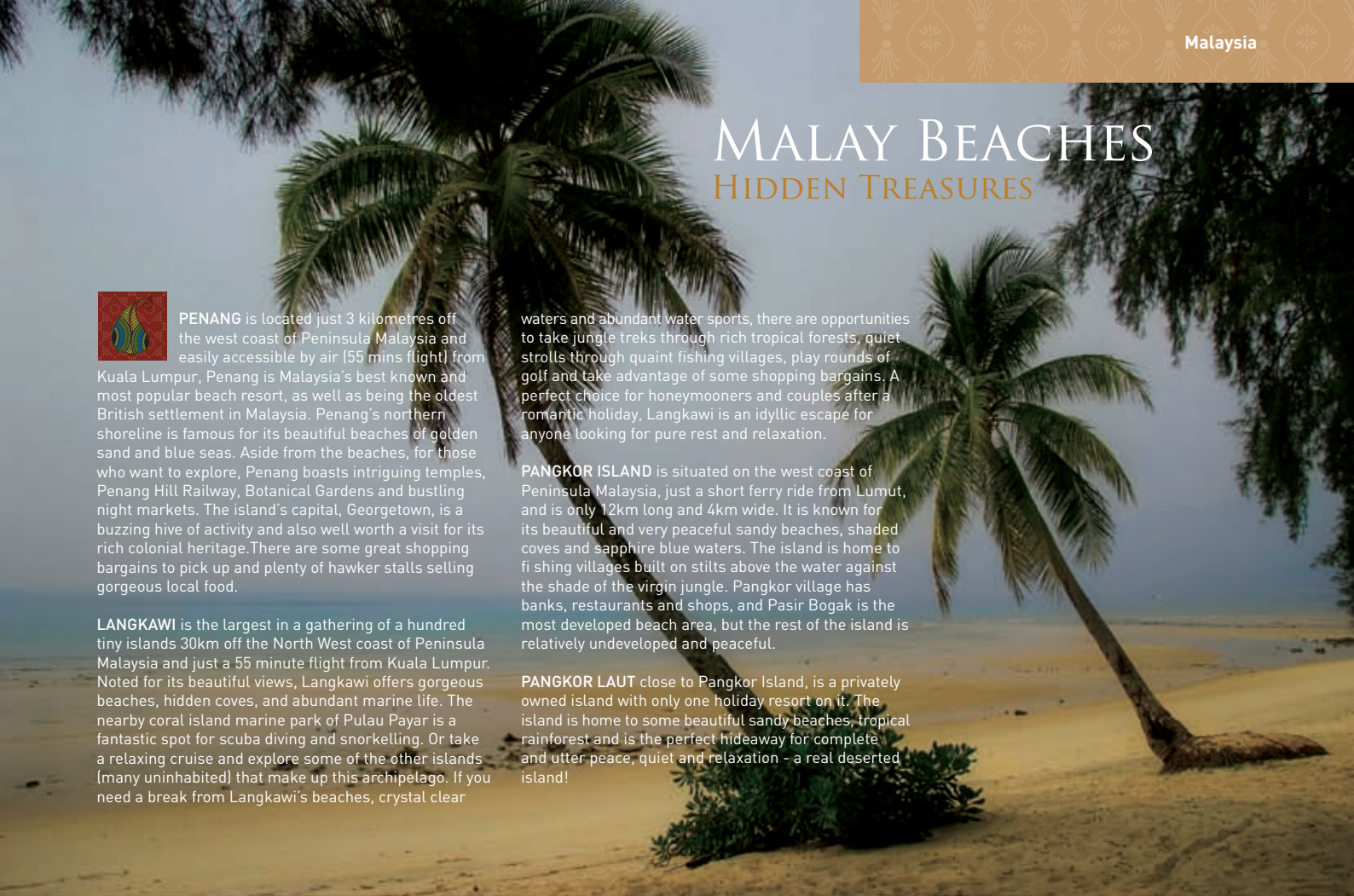
PENANG is located just 3 kilometres off the west coast of Peninsula Malaysia and easily accessible by air (55 mins flight) from Kuala Lumpur, Penang is Malaysia's best known and most popular beach resort, as well as being the oldest British settlement in Malaysia. Penang's northern shoreline is famous for its beautiful beaches of golden sand and blue seas. Aside from the beaches, for those who want to explore, Penang boasts intriguing temples, Penang Hill Railway, Botanical Gardens and bustling night markets. The island's capital, Georgetown, is a buzzing hive of activity and also well worth a visit for its rich colonial heritage. There are some great shopping bargains to pick up and plenty of hawker stalls selling gorgeous local food.

LANGKAWI is the largest in a gathering of a hundred tiny islands 30km off the North West coast of Peninsula Malaysia and just a 55 minute flight from Kuala Lumpur. Noted for its beautiful views, Langkawi offers gorgeous beaches, hidden coves, and abundant marine life. The nearby coral island marine park of Pulau Payar is a fantastic spot for scuba diving and snorkelling. Or take a relaxing cruise and explore some of the other islands (many uninhabited) that make up this archipelago. If you need a break from Langkawi's beaches, crystal clear

waters and abundant water sports, there are opportunities to take jungle treks through rich tropical forests, quiet strolls through quaint fishing villages, play rounds of golf and take advantage of some shopping bargains. A perfect choice for honeymooners and couples after a romantic holiday, Langkawi is an idyllic escape for anyone looking for pure rest and relaxation.

PANGKOR ISLAND is situated on the west coast of Peninsula Malaysia, just a short ferry ride from Lumut, and is only 12km long and 4km wide. It is known for its beautiful and very peaceful sandy beaches, shaded coves and sapphire blue waters. The island is home to fishing villages built on stilts above the water against the shade of the virgin jungle. Pangkor village has banks, restaurants and shops, and Pasir Bogak is the most developed beach area, but the rest of the island is relatively undeveloped and peaceful.

PANGKOR LAUT close to Pangkor Island, is a privately owned island with only one holiday resort on it. The island is home to some beautiful sandy beaches, tropical rainforest and is the perfect hideaway for complete and utter peace, quiet and relaxation - a real deserted island!
